Communication with your child

Students cannot be contacted whilst in class, however if you need to make contact with your child you can call or text them on their phone during break time (recess or lunch) or after 3.05pm. We cannot guarantee that students will receive messages at the end of the day.

Duty of Care

A reminder that staff are not on duty until 8.20am and that students should not be on school grounds or inside school buildings until this time. Prior to this students are the responsibility of parents and/or carers.

Attendance and lateness

It is vital that students attend school every day. A sense of purpose and commitment is achieved with regular attendance. Every child has a chance of success with their learning when they attend regularly. Please encourage your children to value their education and help them become organised and attend every day. Please make appointments before or after school hours. It is also important to get your child to school on time. The school day begins at 8.20am and Care starts at 8.45am. 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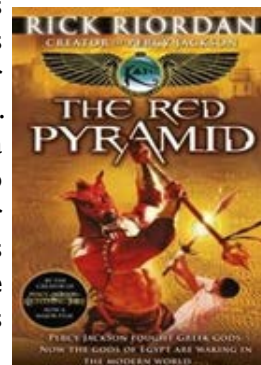

Action and Adventure Fiction

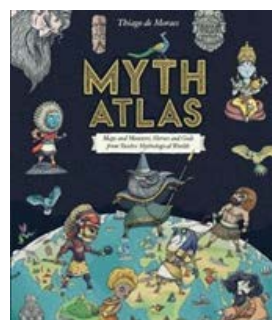
